Basics of fMRI Preprocessing and Analysis

Multiple day sessions, hands-on and theory, designed to acquaint trainees new to fMRI to preprocess (prepare data for further analyses) and perform first-level analyses. Attendees will be able to: appreciate and understand 4D datasets, convert scanner acquired data to nifti format, use FSL (comprehensive library of analysis software tools) to perform basic preprocessing steps (filter, motion and time corrections, spatial smoothing, brain registration), and initial within-subject analysis (multiple regression, experimental design, data fitting, statistical output).
