Introduction to Scientific Programming

January 13 - March 30 | Mondays from 10 am to 1 pm

Neuro 0 – Applications of Medical Imaging for Systems Neuroscience

January 14 | 11:30 am to 12:30 pm

This module will provide students with an introduction to medical imaging technologies and applications for systems level research. Attendees will gain an understanding of common techniques such as magnetic resonance imaging and computed tomography (and more), and how they can be used in neuroscience studies. Topics may be relevant to Neuro II (MDSC 619.02: Systems Neuroscience and Neuropathology) or students' thesis projects.

Neuro 0 – Introduction to Neuroanatomy

January 16 | 11 am to 12 pm

This module will introduce students to basic human functional and chemical neuroanatomy using case studies and practical examples. At the end of the module, students will have a foundation to build on their neuroanatomical knowledge in Neuro II (MDSC 619.02: Systems Neuroscience and Neuropathology).

Leaders in Medicine - Finding a Job as a Clinician-Scientist

January 28 | 12:30 to 1:30 pm

This session, offered by the Leaders in Medicine program as part of their Professional Development Series, will provide an overview of the process of finding a job as a clinician-scientist, and help trainees evaluate important factors such as job availability, compensation, and determining the split between clinical and research hours.

Building Professional Relationships

February 7 | 9 am - 4 pm

This full-day session, facilitated by Terry Wasylak of The Career Clinic, is designed to help participants understand and evaluate their individual strengths in the context of relationships with other people. This highly-effective workshop focuses on building successful professional relationships, handling workplace politics, and communicating effectively. Participants will also complete the Meyers-Briggs' Type Indicator questionnaire.

Resume Writing and Interview Preparation
